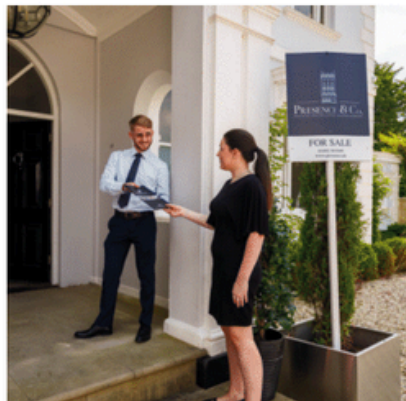

FOREST HILL PARK

Forest Hill Park FC was officially formed in 1992. A group of keen young footballers (Dean Dennis, Peter Stephens & Clayton Walters) – residing in the Forest Hill and Honor Oak Park areas in South East London – decided to form a team, register with the Football Association, that could compete in a structured football league, a progression from the weekly matches in Honor Oak Park.

The club name derives from the area links between Forest Hill and Honor Oak Park, SE23 in the London borough of Lewisham. The club badge was designed around each elevated arrowed tree stands for each founder member and the Oak tree of Honor, in One Tree Hill SE23.

A new dawn ensued at FHPFC, in the early 2000s with the club securing a new home ground in the heart of the borough at Ladywell Arena.

FHP were successful in their application to become members of the National League System Step 6 Kent Invicta League for 2015/16 before the league was rebranded the next season, to become part of the existing Southern Counties East Football League, with Forest Hill placed in Division One for the 2016/17 season. The club would finish in 12th place and then 16th the following campaign.

2018-19 was a good year for the club as they finished in a record 7th place while the 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons were abandoned due to Coronavirus. In the next three years the Club ended 19th, 14th then 15th under the excellent leadership of Darrell Queeley.

A few weeks ahead of the 2024/25 Season Forest Hill Park merged with Sunday League giants SE Dons, and with exciting plans for the future the club will transfer fully into the SE Dons name and brand in time for 2025/26.

SE Dons were founded in 2014 by John McHugh, his son Andrew McHugh and son-in-law Ryan Palmer.

SE Dons is more than a football club; it's a family legacy. For a decade, we have traveled the country, playing Sunday League football and we have often been overlooked in communities. We have collected over 240,000 YouTube subscribers. We have viewers in the multi millions over all platforms and sit comfortably in the top 20 most followed Football Clubs in the country.

Our mission extends beyond the sport. We have lost loved ones along the way and we honour their memories as we ascend to the British Football Pyramid.

The Untold Game

I WANT TO BE ALONE

There is a legend of Swedish sport who achieved things nobody had achieved before, and held records long after their career had come to an end. Cool, clean cut and with an ice cold mentality that saw them calmly defeat opponents on their way to the ultimate glory. And then, at the height of their fame, when the world wondered what might come next, they simply took themselves off of the world stage. Still in their 20s, with years of potential success ahead, they just decided to retire, and give up the pressure of the public eye. And we haven't taken a left turn into tennis here, we're talking about Ove Kindvall.

Born in 1943, Kindvall was from a footballing family. His father played for the local team in Norrköping, and Ove was a frequent fixture on the sidelines. Hoping he had inherited his father's ability, the club enrolled him in their youth team and nurtured his inherited skills. By the age of 19, he was ready, although nobody in Swedish football was prepared for the impact he would make.

Kindvall's strike partner, briefly, was Harry Bild, another highly talented Swedish striker. Although they only played together for a short time, Bild would be an influential presence in his younger teammate's career, especially after leaving the amateur Swedish game for Europe, first in Switzerland, and then in the Netherlands. In his absence, young Ove was setting the Allsvenskan alight, making 84 appearances over his four years at the club, and scoring an impressive 70 goals. It was enough to turn the heads of some big Spanish and Italian clubs, who courted the young striker, but none more than Feyenoord. The Dutch side had European glory in the sights, and having signed Bild a year earlier, wanted to get the Norrköping band back together.

It wasn't an easy transition. Kindvall was used to the freedom of amateur football, and as Sweden has a summer league, he wasn't used to playing in the rain and the mud. He spent much of his first season on the bench, watching Bild play ahead of him, but appreciated that time learning the pressures of professionalism. And it didn't seem to hinder his scoring, with the new signing finding the net 22 times in his 23 appearances.

It was enough that, a year after signing, Feyenoord were happy to give him the starting berth when Bild left the club. It was a turning point of sorts for Kindvall's time in the Netherlands. Without his respected older colleague to defer to, he could focus on his own game and goalscoring. Also without his compatriot, the young forward was forced to engage more in Dutch culture and with his Dutch teammates, which only helped on the pitch. From now on his only Swedish influence would be on international duty, having made his debut for the national side the previous season.

His adaptation to the Dutch way of life was telling, and he continued to score goals at a prolific rate. He was unbeatable over the first ten yards, and in the box was totally unplayable. When Ernst Happel took over in 1969, he made sure Kindvall knew his role at the top of the pitch, eliminating his growing habit of dropping deep to help out the midfield. In the Austrian's first season at the club, Feyenoord reached their zenith, winning the European Cup in extra time against Jock Stein's Celtic. Kindvall, as had become something of a habit, scored the winner, clipping the ball majestically over the goalkeeper. But it would prove to be his swansong in Dutch football.

Kindvall was concerned that the intensity of the Dutch game was affecting his international output, and having struggled at the 1970 World Cup concluded that he was exhausted from his club duties. He had also never acclimatised to playing in the mud - although his goal output would suggest it wasn't a problem - and had a store cupboard of Swedish essentials that he couldn't find in his adopted homeland. He was homesick, and returned to the country of his birth in 1971.

For many, including Feyenoord, the decision to return to amateur football at the height of his abilities was an odd one. The club even offered him a huge contract to convince him to stay, but his heart was set on a return to Norrköping. Back home, he was deployed in the midfield and his goalscoring output understandably dropped. He played for a few years and made an appearance at the 1974 World Cup, before seeing out his career with another goal-laden spell at IFK Göteborg.

When he retired, Kindvall had 259 goals across 344 games, as well as a gaggle of titles to his name. He was the first non-Dutch player to top the Eredivisie scoring charts, a feat he managed in three of his four years in the Netherlands, and something nobody else achieved until Romario. But Greta Garbo before him, and Björn Borg after, he was a Swedish sensation who just wanted to be alone.

Enjoy the game.
