Glebe FC were founded in 1995 by the present Chairman & his wife, Rocky and Grace McMillan.

From humble beginnings with just 1 under 8 team, the club has progressed at various stages, today hosting 20 Junior Teams, 4 vets sides, 1 Ladies Senior Side and of course the First XI, with over 300 members.

We are based in Chislehurst Kent, with 15 acres of grounds. Glebe, in the last couple of years have moved in and built a wonderful new sports complex, comprising of 5 pitches, a new stadium pitch , floodlit training area, multi-purpose Gym and a brand new Social Hub.

It hasn't always been easy. For years Glebe were nomads, winning every Junior Trophy that could be won, including 10 London County Cups at various ages, but never seemingly able to find 'a home of its own'. However we never gave up and moved into our 'New Home' in September 2014.

Also in 2014 Glebe FC won the prestigious 'London FA Standard Charter Community Club of the Year Award', voted by the Executive Committee of the London FA.

After progressing through the age groups and becoming a regular feature in Kent Youth Leagues, it was decided by the Committee back in 2010 to form a Senior Section. We are now in our 5th Season. The initial 2 years we ground-shared at Holmesdale FC. This was only going to be a short term stay as we were desperate to find our own venue. When Old Elthamians Rugby Club experienced differences with the Landlords, we were quick off the mark and signed a 25 year lease at Foxbury Avenue. With the help of the FSIF (Football Stadia Improvement Fund), we have built a stadium which we are really proud of.

Glebe FC continues to make new friends in its venture as a Senior Club. Having narrowly missed out on promotion in 2015/16 (where the winners of Sheppey v Glebe went up), Glebe went on to win step 6 by 12 points in 2016/17 as well as Runners up in the London Senior Trophy. This is our second year in the Premier Division and we are looking to build on last year's performance

We have a brief yet exciting history as a senior Club, which follows an exceptional history as a junior Club. Hopefully more trophies will be added in the years to come, in addition to the Cups and League success.

Today's Visitors

Corinthian FC was founded in 1972 by Mr RJ Billings (snr) to provide football in a safe environment, whilst teaching the players the principles that he believed to be important in sport. The motto was simply “pro omnium beneficio”- for the benefit of all, but on the pitch the principles were simple; “Hard, but fair”. Losing wasn’t considered before the game, but if the result went against us then the players were taught to take it graciously.

For the first ten years of the club's existence we were pleased to welcome such teams as Tottenham, Charlton and Norwich amongst other league teams as well as county and district representative sides as our opposition. On top of these games there were many regular visitors to Gay Dawn Farm from local clubs making up a fixture list of over 60 games per season.

During the 1980s with the arrival of an experienced football manager, Mr Tony Sitford, we progressed from youth football into men’s football playing in the old Southern League. This level of football by a totally amateur club made us unique, but caused problems in the long run in attracting new players. Into the 1990’s we dropped back down to the Kent League and enjoyed many a season in this set up.

Early into the new century we reviewed the whole structure of our football club and decided that we had lost our roots in youth football and this was having a detrimental effect on our senior side. So we decided to withdraw temporarily from senior football, whilst we rebuilt the lower levels of the club. In 2008 we had managed to create a club running 5 sides, from 13 years old through to 18 years old and it became obvious that we needed to consider the next step in our restructuring. For two seasons we had a liaison with Welling United, integrating a senior side within Welling United and developed a reserve side initially playing in Kent Division 2 (season 2008/09) and then moving on (2009/10) into the Suburban League South Division. This partnership has now come to an end. When the opportunity came for us to re-enter senior football as Corinthian Football Club we did not hesitate to take it. Probably 2 years too soon, but the challenge was one we were keen to take. We introduced a second senior side playing in the Suburban League to help us progress our u18’s into men’s football.

The 2010 / 11 season saw Corinthian FC running two senior sides one in the Kent Football League Premier Division and one in the Suburban League South Division plus three youth sides – u14, u15 and u18 in the Kent Youth League. For the 2011/12 season as well as all the above, Corinthian FC had an u18 side in the Ryman Youth League. We feel that that this fills the gap from Kent Youth League to senior football, enabling us to offer a true progression for all our players. The 2012/13, 14/15, 15/16 & 17/18 seasons saw the addition of u13 and u15 team playing in the Kent Youth League.

For our 18/19 campaign we continue with sides in the SCEFL Premier Division, Suburban League Premier Division, Bostik u18 East Division and Kent Youth League u14 Central Division.

Millwall – How low can they get?

It has been said; that if you sit on top of the floodlight pylons at The Hawthornes in West Bromwich and look east, if it was not for the curvature of the planet, your view would only be interrupted by the Ural Mountains, 1200 kilometres beyond Moscow. West Brom is said to be the highest ground in the top four leagues although there is always someone who will through Boundary Park into the mix. A few of were revisiting this at St Andrews which has an elevated position with great views over the Birmingham city centre and surely must be up there with the highest grounds? So what else does a retired Geography teacher do in the midst of Storm Freya while his 'dominant two thirds' bakes a cake for the family?

For the technically minded, the Ordnance Survey website was used to find the height of all 92 football grounds, but in retrospect, Google Earth would have been quicker.

Here are the results:


The Hawthornes is NOT, or more understandingly no longer the highest ground in England and Wales. Nor is it Boundary Park or any other northern ground settled in amongst barren hills and dark satanic mills. The Hawthornes comes in at 161 metres (530 feet) but it is now topped by Forest Green Rovers at 165 metres. Is vegan food a cure for altitude sickness? Now, I'm not sure whether floodlight pylons still exist at some grounds or specifically whether there are pylons at Forest Green or West Brom, but if they do, I reckon the top of the Hawthorn pylons will put you nearer to your God than those at Forest Green.

So West Brom fans can maybe take some comfort from that. According to the OS, Port Vale comes in at a lung emptying 158 metres topping Oldham's ground by less than one metre.

The Top Ten grounds – literally – are:

A quick view shows that five of those are in the midlands which stands to reason; they are as far away from the sea and sea level as you can get. This makes the Ricoh Stadium a tad disappointing at just 94 metres. Mind you, by the start of next season, they may not be hosting Coventry City matches concentrating on the greater personal spending power of Wasps rugby fans!



So what of Millwall? Please accept my apologies if you support Millwall and are bristling at the top line of this article.

Here is my explanation.

The Den comes in as the lowest ground where league football is played . The Ordnance Survey has the ground at just 1.5 metres above sea level, just thirty or so centimetres lower than the Kingston Communication Stadium in Hull. Which may suggest that Global Warming, melting ice sheets and rising sea levels will be bad news for Lions and Tigers.

The next question is whether Forest Green is the highest ground on which league football has been played? Peel Park, home to the original Accrington Stanley until 1962, was just higher than Forest Green at 166 metres. Then you have to delve back into history and think about Seedhall, the old home of Nelson where league football was played in the late twenties and early thirties. Or further back to Glossop North End, or Stalybridge Celtic, Merthyr Tydfil or Aberdare? That problem solving will have to wait until Storm Gareth!

Premier Division Review from SCEFL website 2 March 2019

Corinthian opened up a 6 point gap at the top of the table thanks to a 3-1 home win over Lordswood. Connor Johnson opened the scoring just before the break for the hosts before Adam Hooper levelled for the 10-men Lords. Johnson then got his second of the game with Andres Tobon sealing the win with 10 to play to confirm a 14th consecutive win for his side.

Cray Valley are now best placed to challenge the 'Hoops' after coming away from Beckenham Town with maximum points. Kevin Lisbie and Gavin Tomlin got the goals that put the Millers within 7 points of the leaders with a game in hand. Two points and one place further back are Chatham Town who came from behind to win at Crowborough Athletic. The hosts led early through Jamahl King before a double from Corey Waters-Wright and a debut goal from Harrison Carnegie gave the 'Chats' an important win that keeps them in contention for the big prize.

The bottom 4 sides all picked up atleast a point with Hollands & Blair getting all three in the shock result of the day at the Havill Stadium. Marshall Ratten netted in the first and last minute in a 4-2 win for Blair to give them their first League victory in 12 games.

Croydon drew for the first time this campaign when sharing the honours with Punjab United to get their new management team off to a strong start. Lewis Blake got the goal from the spot for the Trams while Laurent Hamici evened the game just before the hour mark. Rusthall continued their unbeaten run thanks to a 2-2 draw at home to Deal Town but were just a minute away from collecting the win. Nordibik Bobomurodov got the first for the Rustics which Connor Coyne cancelled out just before the break. Stephen Harper then marked his return to the club with what looked to be the winner until Sam Wilson scored in the dying seconds to earn a point for the 'Hoops'.

AFC Croydon Athletic faced their heaviest home defeat of the season as Glebe put on a masterclass to leave the Mayfield Stadium as 4-0 winners. Henry Adeniran, on loan from Dulwich Hamlet, scored on debut to get the visitors off to the perfect start before he turned provider for Jack Harris to nod home the second. 
