

Glebe FC were founded (as the junior side Glebe Globetrotters) in 1995 by chairman Rocky McMillan and his wife Grace. Initially based in West Wickham and starting with just a sole Under 8's team, the club progressed through the age groups. Regulars in Kent's Youth Leagues we won every junior trophy possible – including 10 London County Cups.

After their exceptional beginnings as a Junior side, their committee voted to form a Senior section in 2010 and the newly established team joined the Kent Invicta League (KIL) in 2013-14. In 2014, we also won the prestigious London FA Standard Charter Community Club of the Year Award, as voted for by the Executive Committee of the London FA.

But for years Glebe were nomads, seemingly unable to secure a permanent home. For the first two seasons the senior side groundshared with Holmesdale, but, in 2014, we signed a 25 year lease to take over Old Elthamians Rugby Club. This was a historic day in the club's history, when we had a base to be a focal point for sport in the community, at last.

With the help of the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, we have since built a modern sports complex. The club resides in 15 acres in Chislehurst, comprising 5 pitches, a new stadium pitch, a separate floodlit training area, gym, bar and reception rooms. In 2020/21, there are over 25 Junior teams, one ladies senior side, and of course the First XI, with over 350 playing club members.

Glebe FC's history as a senior side is brief - but exciting. Life began in 2013-14 finishing 10th following up with 7th in 2014-15. The next season we experienced the disappointment of narrowly missing out on promotion, finishing 3rd behind Bearsted and Sheppey United. However, we did win the Kent Invicta League Cup and the London FA Senior Trophy.

In 2016-17 the Kent Invicta League became the SCEFL's First Division and Glebe went up as champions - clear by 12 points. One highlight from last season (2019/20), was an impressive run in the FA Vase, when we reached the 4th Round, knocking out





five opponents (Guildford City, K Sports, Peacehaven and Telscombe, Fisher and Newhaven) before a tough 3-0 defeat at favourites Stowmarket Town.

This is now our 4th season in the SCEFL Premier Division. Gary, Alexander, the ex-Millwall player, has committed himself to the club for another season. We are also delighted to have retained several key players from last season, as well as adding some experienced players, who have not played at his level before.

Off the pitch, we have agreed a new a sponsorship deal with Toolroom Records whose owner, the DJ Mark Knight, has joined the Board of Directors along with local businessman Ben Dhesi. Luxury car dealership, Beck Evans, have also come on board as major sponsors.

We wish all teams and players a safe season and hope that 2020/21 reaches a conclusion in these difficult times.

TOWER HAMLETS FC-A BRIEF HISTORY

Tower Hamlets Football Club is an English football club who are currently members of the Southern County Eastern football league and play at the Phoenix sports club stadium. Up until July 2013 the club was playing under the name Bethnal Green United. The club was established in 2000 by Mohammed Nurul Hoque and Akhtar Ahmed as a community club. The club played in several leagues, including the Canary Wharf Summer League, the Inner London Football League and the London Intermediate League, before joining the Middlesex County League. We were granted Senior status after winning the league's Premier Division in 2009, and were promoted to the Essex Senior League. In the 2009–10 season we finished fifth in the ESL and won both cups operated by the Essex Senior League, beating Burnham Ramblers 4–1 in the final of the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy.


Visit Chislehurst

We feel our grounds at Foxbury are amongst the most picturesque of any football club, especially when you consider Glebe's home is located within the M25. Yet Foxbury is just part of the open space that makes Chislehurst a great place to live and visit. Adjacent to Foxbury are the playing fields of Bart's Hospital and Queen Mary's University, and within a ten minute walk is Scadbury Park with the remains of its moated manor house.

At the heart of the village is Chislehurst Common. This is 180 acres of woods, grassland and heathland which has the Green Flag Award, the 'International Mark of Quality for Parks and Green Spaces'. There are with two ponds (three if it has been raining incessantly!) Situated where gravel was dug in the past, and the old cock pit where cock fighting and probably pre-Queensbury rule challenges also took place. Activities on the common are rather more sedate nowadays. There has been an open air cinema by the Cock Pit, early May sees the crowning of the Chislehurst May Queen, and in the past two years there has been the successful Big Draw Arts Festival.

The commons are private land managed by a team of trustees and hardy volunteers, and it is our privilege to have invited them along here today as our way of thanking these volunteers for helping make Chislehurst the place it is.





SCEFL History

The Southern Counties East Football League is an English football league for teams based in Kent and the South East, which was established in 1966. Until 2013 it was known as the Kent League.

The first Kent League was formed in 1894 and folded in 1959. Despite many of the same clubs having spells in membership, there is no direct connection between the two competitions.

The current incarnation of the league was formed in 1966 as the Kent Premier League (changing to Kent Football League in 1968), and in its early years many of its members were reserve sides of Southern League teams. Gradually, the reserve sides were all shifted down into the lower divisions.

In 2013 the league changed its name to the Southern Counties East League, to reflect the fact that not all of its member clubs played within the county of Kent.

At the end of the 2015–16 season, the league merged with the recently formed Kent Invicta League and the latter became the lower division of the merged league.

Therefore the Southern Counties East Football league now operates two Divisions. The Premier Division is at Step 5 of the Non-League Pyramid with the First Division at Step 6. The promoted teams from the Premier will enter the Isthmian League at Step 4 with relegated teams from the First likely to enter the Kent County League at Step 7.



50 Years ago this Month - October 2020

In the second of this series which looks back fifty years to the 1970 – 71 season, we reach October. Leeds United were setting the pace at the top of the First Division, much to the delight of a young Robert McMillan who was making something of an impact in the Under 14s at Salesian College, in Battersea.

This selection of footballing events comes from the Rothmans Football Yearbook and is interspersed with some global and cultural happenings.

3rd: Four London teams take up the seven top places, all chasing Leeds. The highest crowd of the day (46,196) sees Liverpool beat Chelsea 1 – 0. Freda Payne sits number 1 in the charts with 'Band of Gold'.

4th: Janis Joplin dies. She is the third 'rock star' to die inside four week, all aged 27.

5th: In the League Cup, over 30,000 watch the West London derby between Fulham and QPR while second division Swindon Town put Liverpool out of the competition. Millwall who sit bottom of the Second Division with only a bragging rights win over Charlton to keep the fans happy, lead 2 – 0 over Derby County before exiting the League Cup 2 - 4

8th: Selhurst Park will see a home League Cup tie versus Arsenal. The Palace board decides against an all ticket match but do raise the price of sitting in the stands by four shillings. Jack Charlton is in trouble with the F.A. after announcing in an interview that he had a little black book of names listing the players he was out to get even with. Births of future actor, Matt Damon and current Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan.

10th: Bobby Charlton plays his 500th league match for Man Utd. United lost the match 0 – 1 to Palace. Jimmy Greaves netted his 350th top flight goal for Spurs at Stoke City. Fiji gains independence from the UK. Birth of Dean Kiely, goalie at Palace and Charlton.

15th: Crewe Alex manager Ernie Tagg sacks himself.





17th: Over 50,000 at Highbury see Arsenal win 4 – 0 against reigning champions, Everton. Another 50,000 plus crowd fill Elland Road to see a 2 – 2 draw versus Man Utd. Rodney Marsh nets a hat trick for QPR against Birmingham City.
20th: In the Inter-Cities Fairs Cup (think Europa League ish!) Coventry City are thumped six, nil by Bayern Munich. Chelsea, Man City and Cardiff all have wins in the European Cup Winners Cup.

31st: Rodney Marsh is given the captaincy of QPR and shaves off his beard to show respect for the roll. The writer of this article was one of 12,800 who saw rock bottom Burnley pick up their first league win of the season, a two nil win over a Palace side that was beginning to believe its own publicity!


